Guatemala is divided into 22 departments and each one has its own capital. It is a pluri-cultural and multilingual country that is known for its beautiful landscapes and for being the land of the Mayan Civilization. In this relatively small country, you are within driving distance from many places to visit and explore; from the dark sand beaches to the high mountains and volcanoes. Each destination has its own magic with representative traditions, customs, foods and language.

Closest towns to visit are: Antigua Guatemala (one of our previous Capitals), Tecpán, Xela, Puerto San José, Chichicastenango, Río Dulce and Atitlán (where one of the most beautiful lakes is located).

ARRIVING TO THIS COUNTRY

- ✓ When you arrive in Guatemala, we will pick you up at the airport and take you to your apartment.
- ✓ You will receive a one-time moving expenses allowance in local currency and some basic groceries and supplies.
- ✓ There are a variety of places to live in the city. Our school is in Zone 16, so all teachers live in Zone 15 or 16. Zones are like neighborhoods or zip codes. These zones are in a very nice and safe area of Guatemala.
- ✓ The exchange rate between US dollars and Guatemalan Quetzal is approximately \$1 to Q7.80 (as of 2018).
- ✓ The safest and most effective way to move around in Guatemala is Uber and yellow taxis. Purchasing a car is another option.
- ✓ There are many things to do for fun in Guatemala. In the city there are a wide variety of restaurants, grocery stores, shopping centers, bowling alleys, spas, movie theatres and gyms nearby our school. All of the housing is about a 5 or 10 minutes driving distance away from these locations.
- ✓ At Inter, our Welcome Committee has created a Google Sheet that is shared with all Visiting Fellows: "Best Kept Guate City Secrets". Here, you will have first-hand suggestions of things to do, places to go and where to find your visitor needs.

The curriculum for High School (Grades 9-12) follows a rigorous university preparation program which meets the graduation requirements for both the United States and Guatemala.

- ✓ Our four-year curriculum meets or exceeds the entrance requirements of all major colleges and universities.
- ✓ Seniors are required to complete a major research project for the Guatemalan Ministry of Education (Seminario).
- ✓ In addition to our already-robust curriculum, we offer AP classes in Geography, World History, Psychology, Statistics, Calculus, English Literature and Composition, Chemistry, Physics and Biology.
- ✓ We are also proud to have a strong elective program with a variety of courses including SAT Preparation, Journalism, Yearbook and Science Exploration.

Teaching in High School at Colegio Interamericano is promoted as a place where it "feels like family", and within the first week of classes you can realize this is not a myth.

Inter is truly a student-centric school with warmth, kindness and genuine relationships. Our motto



in the High School for this year was "un equipo", or "one team". We are united in our goal of improving student learning through relationships, trust, and fairness. This is a wonderful place to teach and live.

Teachers have four 80-minute blocks a day and a thirty-five-minute Advisory session with a small group of students at the end of the day. Every day, teachers have one of the eighty minute classes free to plan, collaborate or grade.

We have weekly professional development where we explore assessment, pedagogical strategies, community building and sometimes, activities to laugh and celebrate. Teachers offer suggestions for PD topics and often lead sessions living the concept of distributed leadership.
