HISTORY

In 1976, Colegio Interamericano was founded by Fundación Educativa Guatemala, who sought to provide an alternative for Guatemalan families seeking a high quality bilingual (English-Spanish) education.

The school has been located in La Montaña, zone 16 in Guatemala City since 1981. Colegio Interamericano secured its U.S. accreditation (AdvancED) in 1989 to guide its bilingual program and provide graduates with a U.S. High School Diploma and the Guatemalan Bachillerato Diploma.

Colegio Interamericano currently serves over 1,400 students, and in more recent years, has become a viable choice for an increasing number of international students and mobile families.





The school year has a minimum of 182 student contact days (August to mid-June). For Preschool and Pre-Kinder, each school day is from 8:00 a.m. to 12:50 p.m. For Early Childhood Education and Elementary, Middle School and High School, the school day is from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

GRADING SYSTEM

Early Childhood and Elementary Education present Standards-Based grading and reporting. The remainder of the school, Middle School and High School use the grading system below.

The Guatemalan Ministry of Education requirement for a passing grade is 60 out of 100 points in each subject.

CURRICULAR PROJECT

Colegio Interamericano is secular and bilingual. It is authorized to work with the international calendar (August-June). The Preschool and Pre-Kinder program is full immersion in English. Kindergarten - Grade 12 (5o. Bachillerato) is fully aligned with the requirements of the Curriculum Nacional Base of the Ministry of Education, AdvancEd and the US Common Core standards. Additionally, the NGSS and ISTE standards are incorporated to enrich the educational experience and prepare students with 21st century skills.

Core subjects are taught in English, and bilingual education is supported in Comunicación y Lenguaje and Estudios Sociales classes to ensure that students meet the standards for both a U.S. and Guatemalan diploma.

Citizenship and character development are fundamental aspects of this process. Integrated into the curriculum are positive opportunities for students to develop their character, personalities, attitudes and values.



EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Early Childhood Education (ECE) at Colegio Interamericano is comprised of grades Preschool through Grade 1.

Our primary goal is to foster creativity and exploration while nurturing the child's built-in sense of wonder.

We believe that at this early stage in life the social, emotional and physical development of a child is just as important as their academic development.

We also believe that learning begins at home, and it is continued at school through the collaborative effort of both the parents and teachers.

It includes complementary programs such as the National Honor Society (NHS), Advanced Placement Program (AP classes) and the Student Council (STUCO).









- 5. To develop pupils' self-confidence through understanding the strengths and limitations of themselves and others.











MEDICAL SERVICES

HEALTHY INSURANCE

All students of Colegio Interamericano must be covered by a health insurance, which can be paid through the school in the enrollment process.

The cost of the insurance for the 2022-2023 school year is Q250.00

If the applicant student already has accident insurance, he or she may use it.

ALERTA MÉDICA

Colegio Interamericano hires the emergency and ambulance service provided by Alerta Médica in the activities coordinated by the school.



All students must be covered by this service, which can be paid through the school during the enrollment process. The cost of the service for the 2022-2023 school year is Q90.00

If the applicant student already has Alerta Médica coverage, he or she may use it.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

All students who enroll in Colegio Interamericano for the first time must pay an Educational Contribution to Fundación Educativa Guatemala.



Fundación Educativa has the policy that the educational contribution is non-refundable in case of canceling, withdrawing or reversing the enrollment of a student before the school year starts. If the student withdraws indefinitely and wishes to return, the educational contribution must be paid in its entirety for the amount of the current year.

Children of alumni of Colegio Interamericano, children of alumni of Colegio Americano de Guatemala and siblings of students of Colegio Interamericano have the benefit of obtaining a discount on the total amount. Alumni of Colegio Americano de Guatemala must submit a copy of their graduation degree to obtain the benefit.

TUITION & TRANSPORTATION

The tuition and transportation fee is annual and may be paid in 10 installments. Payment must be made before day 10th of each month to avoid late charges (2% on balance due).

Colegio Interamericano will send a financial statement on the last business day of each month as a reminder of payment by email to father, mother and guardian.

Note: The enrollment fee is non-refundable. The person who signs the contract has the right to withdraw from it within a period not exceeding 5 business days, starting on the day when the contract is signed, only if the service has not been used.
