AASCA TRACK AND BASKETBALL EVERYTHING YOU NEED TO KNOW

AASCA Track and Field stood out again this year, breaking records and earning numerous first and second-place finishes. From Inter Connected, we congratulate all the in both individual winners, categories and in group relay and high jump events. Sofia Urizar with an outstanding shone performance, taking first place in the 800 meters, 1500 meters, 3000 meters track (breaking once again the AASCA record), and 3000 meters cross country.

In the women's relay competitions, the U-20 team earned second place in the 4x100 (comprised of Camila Scheel, Ivanna Mena, Giuliana Marsicovetere, and Analia Gonzalez), 4x400 (with Isabella Torres, Giuliana Marsicovetere, Sofia Urizar, and Analia Gonzalez), and 4x1000 (formed by Sofia Urizar, Elena Ponce, Inés Aguirre, and Ariela Aguirre). Meanwhile, the U-15 team took second place in the 4x100 (composed of Katia Spross, Fátima Toledo, Lena María Mancia, and Cristina Escobar), second place in 4x400, with Camila Velásquez breaking the AASCA record, and first place in 4x1000 thanks to Natalia Campo.

individual events, Giuliana Marsicovetere excelled with second place in the 400 meters, while Analia Gonzalez achieved first place in the 100 and 200 meters. Katia Spross also stood out with second place in the 80 meters and first place in long jump. María Belén Díaz shone with first place in the 80 meters (breaking the AASCA record) and 300 meters. In the men's categories, Gianluca Marsicovetere earned third place in the 100 meters, Paul Brichaux placed third in high jump, and Jose Pablo Lee secured 300 place in the meters. Additionally, the U-15 men's relay team, composed of Luis Felipe Verdugo, took third place in the 4x1000m.

A special recognition goes to Sofia Urizar, who broke her own AASCA records, and to the MVPs of each category: Sofia Urizar (U-20 Women's MVP), María Belén Díaz (U-15)MVP), Women's Gianluca Marsicovetere (U-20 Men's MVP), and Mateo Gómez (U-15 Men's MVP). Finally, we celebrate the team achievements: the U-15 women's team earned first place, the U-20 women's team took second place, and the U-15 women's relay broke the AASCA record. Congratulations to all the impressive for their athletes achievements and for continuing to make Colegio Interamericano proud once again.

This year Interact launched an initiative called the Wheelchair Challenge. The objective was to collect money to buy wheelchairs for those in need, and the outcome turned out to be amazing, raising Q6,208. It was wonderful to see the school come together to help society in this beautiful way.

All of highschool participated in the challenge. Grade 10, as the main donor, managed to raise Q1,124.00. Grade 11, was the closest to the title of most donations by being able to contribute with Q1,038.90. Grade 9 was able to donate Q491.00. And grade 12 also had some part to play, with an additional donation of Q165.00. All the grades made a total of Q2,818.90 with donations alone.



The school also ran a bake sale to raise more funds for those in need of wheelchairs. This brought in an additional Q3,398.00, which far exceeded expectations.

As a total, joining the money raised from the kind donations of each grade and the bake sale, the total was Q6,208. We can proudly say we raised enough money to provide over 50 wheelchairs for those in need.

This challenge not only reinforced the collective strength within the school community, but also showed us how kindness can make a difference.


